The City of Oxford Rowing Club is Oxford's largest and most successful rowing club. It was founded in 1968 following the amalgamation of Neptune RC (1863) and Hannington RC (1904), and is affiliated to the Amateur Rowing Association.

We are committed to provide opportunities to participate in the sport of rowing for people in Oxford and surrounding areas.

We strive to achieve success at local, regional and national level across our membership of men, women and juniors.

When you join City of Oxford Rowing Club you are becoming part of a Club and we hope you are able to enjoy your time as a member both in the sport and the life of the Club.

City of Oxford Rowing Club Rules

The City of Oxford Rowing Club is run under the City of Oxford Rowing Constitution, known here on as the Constitution. A copy of the Constitution is held behind the bar.

- The Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Club. The Committee is defined in the Constitution. The committee members' names, duties and photographs are on the Club notice board. Officers are elected annually at the Annual General Meeting.
- The Club Captain: is responsible for rowing activities in accordance with the constitution and British Rowing regulations.
- Squad Captains: for Women and Men The Squad Captains will answer to the Club Captain in all rowing matters in accordance with the constitution and British Rowing regulations.
- The Club and its members shall adhere to the current British Rowing Row Safe water safety code.
- In addition the Club has a Safety Policy. This is an appendix to the Constitution and the Club appoints a Safety Officer, who is a Committee member.
- The Club follows the British Rowing Policy on Child Protection Procedures in Rowing. The Club Mark officer is part of the committee. The Club has a Welfare Officer the current officer's name and conduct details are on the Club notice board.
- All Full, Student, Sculling, Coxing, Junior and Ordinary Members must comply with the directions of the Captains and will be eligible to vote at the Captain's Meetings, AGM's and EGM's.
- A person who has been expelled from, or refused membership of CORC or British Rowing, shall not be eligible for membership.
- The Committee may in its discretion; decline to accept renewal of membership, from any person. An appeal can be made using the Appeals process available in the Constitution.
- No intoxicating liquor will be sold on the premises to any person under the age of 18.
- Members may resign giving one month's clear notice in writing to the Secretary. Subscriptions are non-refundable.
- A member shall be deemed to have resigned from the Club if, after due notice in writing, he has not paid in 30 calendar days the annual subscription from the due date each year. A person may rejoin at any time during that year but consideration maybe given to outstanding subscription.
- Any member violating any of the rules or regulations of the Club, may, by unanimous resolution of the Committee, be subject to a disciplinary process. The process is found in the Constitution.
- In the event of gross misconduct a member may be expelled. The appeal process is found in the Constitution.
